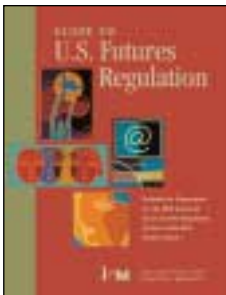

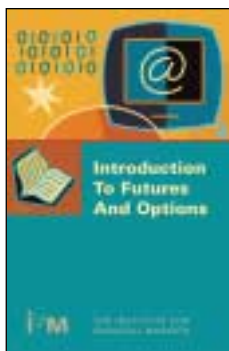

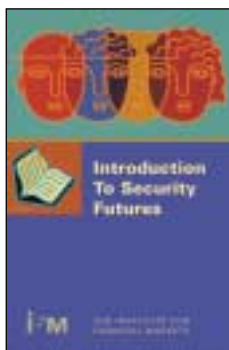

Data Center

- Tick Equity Database — Comprehensive intra-day historical data with tick-by-tick price and volumes to the second on approximately 7,000 U.S. equities since 1973.
- One-Minute Equity Database — Historical data on 1,900 U.S. equity symbols since 1991: date, time, open, high, low, close and volume per one-minute interval. Includes a single-step software to adjust prices for stock splits and create different time intervals of any size and date range.
- Survivor Bias-Free Equity Database — Tick-by-tick price and volumes to the second on approximately 4,000 U.S. equities currently inactive and with at least three years of price history since 1993, including firms that were acquired, ceased operations, were de-listed, filed bankruptcy or went private.
